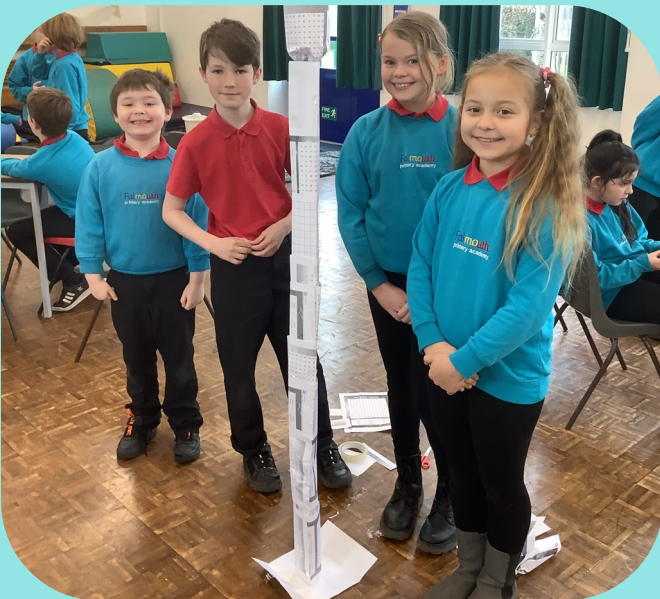
Seahorse Class
